The Crichton Opportunity attracts fans

International Women's Day seemed the perfect time to formally launch the SWI's ambitious plans for a Visitor Learning Centre in Dumfries in collaborative partnership with The Crichton Trust.

The SWI, The Crichton Trust and the project architects, O'donnellBrown and White Arkitekter, laid out plans for the innovative building, the archives which will be housed there, and the plans for a dynamic programme of events to be held on-site, as outreach events in communities around Scotland, and online.

The Visitor Learning Centre, which will open in 2027, will become a beacon of learning, a home for our heritage, to tell the story of rural lives and showcase the role women in Scotland have played and continue to do so. Outreach programmes will ensure communities across Scotland are involved too.

The enthusiasm in the room was clear, with more than 40 supporters, MSPs and councillors, academics and regional and national stakeholders all excited by the possibilities. See what they said here - https://rb.gy/w659gq

We were delighted to be joined by SWI 'royalty' at the launch too! Three great-granddaughters of Catherine Blair, our founder, joined SWI CEO Diane Cooper for a tour of the proposed site and discussed outline plans for a community art project led by The Great Tapestry of Scotland's Andrew Crummy MBE. SWI Presidents' Assembly 2025

SWI National President Mary Burney welcomed representatives from 22 Federations to Stirling for the very first SWI Presidents' Assembly at the beginning of March.

Presidents or their chosen representatives discussed positive steps each Federation can take to embrace The Crichton Opportunity and promote the SWI and encourage membership growth in their own areas.
