Get crafty for the Vaughan Nash Trophy 2026!

Whether you're a knitting pro, a patchwork enthusiast, or just love trying new creative things with friends, the Vaughan Nash Trophy is the perfect opportunity to get crafting! It's open to all members – no matter your level of experience.

This special SWI community competition brings people together from their own Institutes and groups across Scotland to work together to create and display five handmade items based on a fun theme.

For 2026, the theme is Festivals – and you can get as creative as you like! Think music festivals, arts festivals, harvest, Easter, or Christmas... or go global with colourful celebrations like Holi, Mardi Gras, or Carnival. The goal is to craft a display full of colour, culture, and creativity.

What you'll make

Each group entry consists of five items made by your team, and will include:

- One knitted or crocheted item
- One item using a sewing technique (e.g. patchwork or appliqué)
- Three items of your own choice, using any handcraft techniques you like

Who can enter?

You only need at least two people to form a group (there's no maximum number). Your team can be members of your own Institute or group, or be made up of members from different Institutes or Federations – perfect for meeting new people and teaming up with friends. You have to be a member to enter.

Why enter?

The Vaughan Nash Trophy is more than a competition – it's a celebration of creativity, teamwork, and community spirit. The entries are judged as a group display, and all the work is showcased at the SWI National Conference – a fabulous event held every three years.

So whether you're a crafting veteran or just starting out, now's the time to gather your team, get inspired, and start creating!

Working with children?

On 1st July 2025, new legal requirements under the Disclosure (Scotland) Act 2020 took effect, requiring all individuals in 'regulated roles' with children or protected adults to hold a valid PVG. SWI Federations and Institutes with SWI Junior Dippers groups, or overseeing activities for children must ensure compliance, including proper PVG checks for demonstrators and supervisors. This legislation emphasises the importance of safeguarding and maintains that members working with children or protected groups must have completed the PVG process. Membership fees deadline news

Federation Office bearers are advised that all National membership fees must be paid in full before 1st November 2025.

To ensure the SWI remains fully compliant with OSCR regulatory and audit requirements, all National membership fees must be paid in full, accompanied by a fully completed and accurate payment form, before **1st November 2025**. Incomplete or late submissions may compromise our financial reporting obligations. Prompt and accurate payment is essential to support audit readiness and regulatory compliance.

A National membership fee of £30 per member and £10 per Junior member is mandatory and must be paid in full no later than 1st November 2025.

Submission of this form is compulsory. All sections must be fully and accurately completed at the time of submission. Incomplete forms will not be accepted.
