In Memoriam: Celebrating Brenda Shone

Moray and Nairn Federation member Brenda Shone sadly passed away on Friday 19th September. Brenda was a stalwart member of, initially, the WI then SWI for over 40 years.

On moving to Scotland she joined Lochaber Federation where she served as Federation Secretary for a number of years before moving further North. Brenda was a member of both Cawdor, where she had held the posts of President and Secretary in the past, and Duffus Institutes, served on the executive committee for many years including nine as Federation Secretary, had been a Central Councillor and served on the finance committee.

Organisation was one of Brenda's many strengths. She played a central part in the organising of the National H&H conference in 2013 when it was held in Elgin. She also took it upon herself to visit local shops, hotels and cafés to warn them that there would be an influx of Rural ladies descending on Elgin. It came as no surprise that Brenda then became involved in the planning of the 2017 National Centenary celebrations. She was integral in starting an SWI archive while helping to plan the Centenary exhibition. It was a very proud moment for Brenda when she met The Princess Royal at the opening of the exhibition.

Brenda was such a knowledgeable woman, what she didn't know about SWI wasn't worth knowing. She was known by SWI members the length and breadth of Scotland but it is as a Moray and Nairn member that she will be most missed. Her friendliness, kindness, support, advice and oh, how can we forget that dry sense of humour.

Our thoughts go out to Brenda's husband Gary and her four legged friend Percy.

Legal Update on UK Supreme Court Ruling

We are currently taking advice regarding the implications of the UK Supreme Court decision so that we can ensure that the Scottish Women's Institutes operates in an appropriate and lawful manner. As part of this process we are also reviewing our Equity, Diversity and Inclusion Policy.

You may be aware that the Equality and Human Rights Commission have completed their consultation and are currently updating their Code of Practice for services, public functions and associations and our review will need to take account of the final version of that Code of Practice when it is approved by Parliament.

We will act in accordance with the legal advice that we receive and in accordance with the updated Code of Practice in due course.
