Members create Community Action Plan

SWI Office Bearers from all over the country met for an important afternoon of creating a countrywide SWI Community Action Plan to protect the future of the organisation,

This – our first-ever hybrid event – saw 140 members gather in-person in Edinburgh and another 40 members join online to discuss the theme 'Preventing Institute Closures'. Members created ideas to rejuvenate Institutes, maximise fundraising opportunities, appeal to more women, and talked about what had worked in their areas. These ideas are now being collated into an SWI Community Action Plan, and a draft, written by members for members, will be sent to all Office Bearers this month for consultation on how useful it seems, before a finalised plan is released.

A member survey will follow shortly afterwards, where all members can have their say on the SWI. Your feedback is important as the Board of Trustees move forward to make the SWI sustainable for the future.

We are pleased to say the Office Bearer Gathering 2024 was a huge success, with a raffle raising £359 for future SWI Junior Dippers projects, and members enjoying the new hybrid format of the event. Here's what attendees said...

- "Normally I do not attend national meetings as I find they can be just talking shops but this meeting was different."
- "Good to see the acknowledgement of the key role of Federations in supporting and sustaining new groups/Institutes."
- "An excellent event which refreshed my aim to keep the SWI in existence for many years to come."
- "Thoroughly enjoyed the day. Great idea to have people sit at a table with people one did not know. This led to lots of new issues and opportunities experienced in other Institutes. Questions to be debated were on point."
- "The opportunity to meet with representatives from other Institutes outwith our own Federation and share good practice was extremely helpful."
- "Perhaps it's time to learn from successful Institutes where membership has grown. What are they are doing that others are not?"

Resolis romp to victory at Ruralympics

SWI Outstanding Member of the Year

The Margaret Whiteford Trophy for Outstanding Member of the Year celebrates the members who go above and beyond for their SWI communities. Members who are great ambassadors for everything we hold dear – friendship, lifelong learning, and sharing skills – and who get the most out of volunteering for the charity.

This year the standard was very high, and judges had a hard job, so to avoid argument decided three runners-up would share the honours. The overall winner, however, was an easy choice, so congratulations go to Rosemary Duncan of King Edward Institute, Aberdeenshire Federation – see her reaction in the video below!

Mary Burney, SWI National President, said: "Rosemary's Institute closed its doors after Covid, but because of her love for the SWI, she found another Institute to join. While getting used to new routines and different ways. she reacted to a very immediate need to support the Turriff Group who were also struggling post-Covid. As part of that support, and with a very small committee she took on the mammoth task of resurrecting the bulb show.

When we looked at all the nominations for the Outstanding Member of the Year, we all agreed that Rosemary was the epitome of a member who responded willingly to a very present need and is a fantastic example of the motto 'if you know a good thing, pass it on'. We felt that because she agreed to help for one specific event, and the way she did it, she produced a fantastic grounding for moving forward – and she said she enjoyed it!

While giving unstintingly of her own time she also guided the team, including three newbies, through the process but, moreover, she recorded everything electronically in an understandable format so that details of the work required for the lead up, the show day and follow up are available for future use.

We felt Rosemary's willingness to share her skills, encourage others to learn and give them the confidence to try new ventures is a huge part of what the SWI stands for."
