Protecting our heritage The SWI archiving project

The SWI's offices hold a trove of remarkable artefacts which feature stories showcasing the evolution of women's roles, contributions, and unwavering resilience over time. From the initial governance documents to delicate craft items gifted by the Needlework Development Scheme (NDS), this collection encapsulates the essence of the SWI journey. It serves as a touching reminder of the remarkable spirit that defines women in rural communities.

As we navigate the cost-of-living crisis, a changing economy, and decades of membership decline, the urgency of safeguarding the SWI heritage becomes increasingly important. This is why we're spearheading a comprehensive archiving project, estimated to span two years or more.

The imminent sale of the Edinburgh office has heightened concerns about preserving SWI's heritage. We have a leaving date of September 22nd and will be relocating to a more economical office within Edinburgh in the next month. We will update you on that shortly.

While members have recently curated specific items, such as loan box craft materials, most artefacts have never undergone a professional survey or historical archiving process. This underscores the need to prioritise the protection of these invaluable historical assets which are of national importance.

The overall aim of the archiving project is to establish a curated and easily accessible heritage collection for the SWI. This includes creating an oral history repository, where the voices and memories of SWI members are immortalised alongside physical artefacts.

Who's involved?

To ensure the proper initiation of the archiving process and project, we have collaborated with many external stakeholders who share an interest in SWI heritage. These esteemed collaborators have generously provided guidance and expertise to advance this significant and ambitious heritage project. Our valued partners include: The University of Edinburgh, University of Glasgow, University of Stirling, National Galleries Scotland, National Museums Scotland, Craft Scotland, Traditional Arts+Culture Scotland, Business Archives Council and Historic Environment Scotland.

How will it be funded?

We are exploring potential funding support towards the archiving project, however if we were a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO), this would significantly bolster funding opportunities. Over the next few weeks you will be asked your opinion on the SWI becoming a SCIO. This will not affect the current constitution but will enable us to seek major funding for all aspects of the heritage project as well as general SWI activities.

Archive storage space in Scotland is scarce, however we have been hugely successful in teaming up with **The National Archives Council** and **Ballast Trust** to secure a storage and archiving facility that will accommodate our needs over the next two years.
